### **Complex Meetings**

Ian, Kevin & Mark are having regular meetings with Simon Cottee, the Downshire Complex Manager. Below are the notes from the last meeting.

- Q There have been a few comments on the state of the greens after the last couple of competitions, what is your response.
  - A The disease is called 'Dollar Spot' that hasn't been seen before at Downshire. Has been treated, cost £1000 for 10 litres of treatment. Greens being sanded & over-seeded to promote growth while weather still good.
- Q What is the plan for all the leaves coming down.
  - A The leaves are being collected every weekday and then being blown into the rough. They are then being cut up as mulch.
- Q How confident are you that drainage install will be effective.
- A Total unknown until the rain comes. Extra drainage on right side of 13<sup>th</sup> should stop water backing up on the tee side of the new ditch, thus improving conditions. Hope to keep at least 13 holes open over winter. There will be work on new drainage on tee side of 16<sup>th</sup> fairway, in the lowest point, as well as feeder lines going from left side into the new drain. This scheduled for week of 13<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> October, but would hopefully take only a couple of days with the new trenching machine.
- Q What frustrates you the most being complex manager.
- A Comments on the internet (or keyboard warriors). If someone has an issue or problem with the complex,
   I would rather be spoken to about it there & then so maybe an answer could be given straight away. An open dialogue is more productive than comments on the internet.

#### For information.

**Tee Boxes** – some are now off mats, those out of commission have been over-sanded and seeded to promote growth while weather still good ahead of next year, this will pay dividends going forward. Mark mentioned that the rubber tees need to be changed, this will be addressed.

**Pitch & Putt** – will be closed at the end of October. There needs to be an archaeological survey done to make sure there are no Bronze Age or Roman artifacts due to nearby sites (Caesars Camp, Bill Hill Bronze Age Barrow etc).



Just a quick note on how to enter any competition.

You should sign up on Master Scoreboard. Competitions will open approximately 6 weeks prior to each competition, 10 weeks for the majors, and will remain open until approximately 10 days prior to the date of the competition.

Once the enty has been closed and you want to be added to the start sheet, you will be added to a reverve list. You will only be added if someone else has dropped out of the competition.

This has been in place throughout this year and was bought in due to the 600+ changes made to start sheets of the various midweek & weekend competitions throughout 2024.











# Message from Dean Pullen, Competitions Secretary

### **Winter Competitions**

Having trialed mixed tee competitions during this year, we are planning to make all winter competitions, except the Ray Winter League, from the 1st November to the 31st March mixed tee competitions. To implement this, it will be dependent on agreeing the correct course set up with the Complex as, under the current course set up (see below) we cannot put this plan in place. Once implemented we are hoping this move will keep more members playing during the winter months. In preparation, I will circulate a list of the tee preferences already chosen for you all to review, so if you are not on the list, or wish to change your preference, you can let me know before the competitions start.

### **Course Set Up**

Due to the current course set up, a mixture of grass tees and mats, competitions will be non-handicap qualifying until further notice due to the fact the course is not rated under this set up. We will be working with the Complex to see if we can resolve this situation so we can get back to qualifying competitions as soon as possible. As the winter months set in, we will be monitoring the course conditions to ensure the handicap qualifying status of competitions is reviewed on a competition by competition basis.
